Confirm ribbons and trophies quantity

Jacky has spoken to the trophy supplier, same prices as last year for trophies and ribbons. 20 horse heads, four plaques for teams. Ribbons to 10th place this year and check at the AGM to lower this to 5th place.

Intermediate Riders, just to first place. Two Big 3 Awards needed.

Discussion to clarify who receives the AGM booklet. Two mail lists, one goes with the newsletter and the other to 209 members who do not receive the newsletter. AGM minutes online only, will not be mailed.

Ride stationery: Agreed to stop sending ride stationery folders by mail, instead the paperwork can be downloaded. This will save a lot of money in postage. **Resolved** this change takes effect from 1 Jan 2020.

Express post cost included on log books. Jacky has one member who refuses to pay the extra \$7. Agreed to ask the member for written confirmation that she accepts that the log book is not covered by insurance and she will pay replacement cost if it's lost in the mail.

Rides for approval

Tom Quilty /Tooraweenah –3, 4 and 5 July 2021 – 160km. Not formally approved by NSW and needs to be endorsed by AERA. Hold over.

State Champs – Kowen Forest ACT – 6, 7, 8 June 2020. This is an EOI and it doesn't close until next month. Hold over. Closing date 18 October.

Shahzada – 24-28 August 2020. Approved.

Zone 6 -Ride from Minimbar - Nabiac. 10, 20 and 40. 14 and 25 March. Approved

Kiwarrak - 26 and 27 July 2020. Their traditional date. Approved

Standing Items

State Championship 2020 - Agenda Item October. Hold over.

Ratification of decisions made between meetings

Discussion between Sean Griffin, Kerry and Tony noted, including the suggestion that Sean should address his concerns to the whole SMC.

AERA meetings. Peter gave his report.

- It's been a busy time at AERA over the last couple of months. Peter discussed correspondence from
 the RSPCA regarding horse welfare, and in particular concern that horses not vaccinated against
 Hendra virus will not receive timely treatment at rides. The response advises about bio security
 procedures and referral facilities being organised in advance for all rides. Also notes AERA policy
 follows government guidelines.
- Rulebook: has been a query about the wording of rule 50.2. Changing the word "must" back to "should" in one of the rules which concerns the use of log books. A couple of typos need correcting, to be ratified at the November AERA meeting.
- A request to post a survey about electrolyte use on Facebook. The process for getting a "Letter of No Objection" for members wanting to compete overseas is under review.

2019 NSW Office of Sport Grant project -

Advertising campaign: advertising will probably be arranged and funded in two halves, one for the last half of 2019, and second half in early 2020. Noted Jacque's view that she can organise for advertising to be undertaken with support in place for the Bullio ride. Computers to be purchased and ready for start of 2020. Allocation includes computer and software, one per zone. Also first aid kits, John feels we need kits for serious trauma. Allow for neck splints and other things to be added. Consider buying waterproof storage boxes. Also funding scanners for CSs.

Play by the Rules: On going

New member incentive proposal from Belinda and Jacque

Forum proposal gone through in detail, with final agreement that Belinda look at the ideas discussed and put together a further proposal. Want to target current members and not just new members. Grant funding is available. Names of suggested presenters were discussed, covering a variety of subjects. Belinda will contact these people. **AGM Proposal – Annexure E. Resolved** that Belinda continue to work on the concept.

Tony Warren: President,

Is there a discounted entry fee for junior riders? Ride organisers can do this, some do, others don't. Tony received a query regarding an alteration of a log book at a ride. Tony will confirm details and advise the writer. Question about whether the AERA volunteer accident policy provides ambulance cover. Seems it does not. Kerry will confirm and if so, write to the AERA requesting that future policies include this cover.

Noni Seagrim: VP, AERA, website, Facebook, Child Protection: No report.

John Howe: Treasurer, Newsletter, Zone 2 Delegate

As at 1300 today we are holding the following cash reserves:-

I would be grateful to you all if anyone can give me any Tied Grant expenditure items or a timeline for expenditure. I realise that some thousands need to be carried over to next year for the AGM and this is not a

problem. As you can see, the IBD holding the Tied Grant money matures on 30th Sept and I'd like to get an idea of how much to release to the main account.

Keep in mind that we are expecting income of \$12,232.00 from the last 5 rides of 2019. Our estimated expenditure between now and the end of the year is \$21,117.20. This will leave a surplus in the bank account of \$14,602.51. The best news being that the estimated ride income from Kiwarrak, Currowan and Shahzada has exceeded the estimated income based on last years figures and with luck, the trend will continue. To date we have expended \$2,672.59 from the tied grant leaving us a balance of \$26,327.41 to expend.

I have given some thought to Tony's suggestion of Incentives to Ride Organisers. I have done some basic Arithmetic and have arrived at the following conclusion:

This year we have had 19 Endurance events either run or on the Calendar.

Ride income actual \$42,580.46 Estimated Income \$12,232.00 Total Income for 2019 \$54,812.46 Less AERA levy \$4.00 \$10,968.00 \$43,844.46

Less insurances \$2,897.50

Total Income minus costs \$43,946.96

Average ride income \$2,155.10

I have spoken to a few Ride organisers who said they would run extra rides if there was a financial incentive, so. If say Joe Blow runs his usual ride in May he applies to NSWERA to run another in September of the same year, we advance him \$2,000.00 and if the trend of averages runs true we get back approx. \$2,155.10. The exercise is cost neutral for NSWERA SMC, puts on an extra ride and further promotes the sport. Ditto for new or returning rides to get them up and running.

In regard to 160km rides that are appended to current approved rides or traditional rides, a straight out grant of \$1,000.00 to help defray costs. In the case of Zone Championships., a grant of \$500.00 provided the ride is a minimum of 100kms.

Newsletter. September October Newsletter has been printed and should be hitting letter boxes now.

The deadline for the November December Newsletter is 10th October. This will be the end of year Christmas edition. Also any articles that pertain to the AGM will need to be in this Newsletter.

Zone Two. Tooraweenah are working towards the TQ21 goal they have set. Windeyer and Bullio cup are upcoming Zone Two rides and of course Burraga, while not a Zone Two ride is set on the beautiful Central West, more beautiful now after rain with more forecast. I have canvassed the Zone Two Ride Organisers and Burraga for people interested in doing First Aid courses under the Tied Grant. Most ROs have First aid people in attendance already but will pass the word. Zone two The Best In The West.

Treasurer, Newsletter and Zone Two Delegate.

John outlined his proposal to incentivise ride organisers to run additional rides. Went through his figures in some detail. **NSWERA Income & Expenses Forecast 2019-2020 see Annexure B.**

Kerry Spratt: Secretary, Public Officer, AERA, IDP, Grants

Email from a member concerning an incident that occurred on the Steps at Shahzada, problem being a spectator on course whom the member thought was creating an unsafe situation. The ride committees set the rules and decide whether people can access the course. Discussion on how best to deal with this sort of problem. Agreed to write to the person requesting that they don't approach horses on course without invitation. Also to write to RO advising the SMC will support whatever they decide to do about spectators on course. Letter regarding encouragement for Standardbred horses to participate, John to request this member to go ahead with her proposal.

Reminder from the AERA regarding ensuring that Invasive Treatment Reports are entered in AERAspace.

Letter from a member in response to correspondence from the committee was tabled and discussed in camera

Peter Bice: AERA, Ride Standards/Feedback, Governance

A couple of Shahzada feedback forms have been forwarded on.

Jo Davis: Ride calendar, website, stationery

Easter – we have not put anything out canvassing a ride carnival. Sussex committee would like that weekend. Jo to advise that they should put in a ride booking form.

Matthew Walker: Horse Welfare, Early Warning System, Vet Liaison, Biosecurity: No report.

Belinda Hopley: Chief Stewards and TPRs, Grants, Zone 5 Delegate *Ride Reports:*

Kiwarrak, 27-28/7/19, 10k, 20k & 40k Sat, 40K & 80k Sun.

The ride went well. 3 Treatments: 1 preride, 1 after the 1st leg, and 1 after the ride. No rest orders and all doing well now. 1 rider fell in the first few k's. An ambulance was called, rider is good now too.

Shahzada, 26-30/8/19, 400k and 120k.

Table Top and Wingello reports are still outstanding.

CS/TPR:

We had 6 TPR's that are now provisional status, and most worked at Shahzada (except for Peter Bice who was busy riding and came 4th, so congratulations Peter!) They were very good and gained confidence quickly. I shall remind all CS's to ensure all forms are returned with the CS report.

South Coast Zone:

We have 4 names for consideration for mentors Talea Hasko-Stewart, Rob Caitlin, Jesse Buchan and Fia Hasko-Stewart. A FAO has not yet been identified.

Other:

Cate Plummer from NSW EA has rung me back about the MCP. You have to be an EA Steward and I am waiting to hear back from the pathways officer. I have prompted Cate and am still waiting to hear.

I was disappointed to hear a disparaging comment about a provisional TPR made by an experienced endurance rider at Shahzada. Later I was more disappointed when this same rider requested a certain TPR to do their horse when they arrived for vetting.

The 1st phase of the Step up Program is ready to go. The AGM – suggest a vet course

Other:

'18 Survey results (very basically) were that 65% of people are interested, with 25% already having tried some form. Prizes and awards not necessarily important, but social opportunities a good reason to have a go.

New riders want:

- More information on everything about endurance; feeding, training, where to go, what are the rules etc.
- Only want to do rides under 40km.
- Want someone to talk to and ideally, to train with.
- More local rides

What distance would you like to ride? Ride distance most favoured is -65% less than 20k, 48% 20 – 40k, 24% 40 – 60k and 16% 80k+.

What has stopped you getting in involved?

70% would like more info and someone to guide them so far the main impediment. Not knowing what to do or who to talk to and limited access to rides in then local area also featured highly as an impediment.

What info would be helpful for new riders?

71% wanting more information on rules and etiquette was in the lead. New riders also wanted to know more about training and feeding, vetting and ride locations. A review of the open-ended responses ('Other') actually showed answers that could have been fitted in one of the previous categories (e.g. more information on where riders train? and 'all of the above'.)

Recommendations -

The above information suggests the sport would benefit from frequent endurance education and training ride days. Ideally these would be offered in as many local areas as possible to reduce travel distance and increase attendance.

Even more importantly new riders want a mentor, ideally local to them. Previous initiatives focussing on rewards, points etc. are not attractive to this population (although they may be for people remaining in the sport and going on to longer distances).

A conscious investment in getting current endurance riders to link in with new riders and share their expertise and training grounds is likely to be the only significant action that will increase new interest.

Further investigation into declining membership numbers may also yield fruitful information.

It has been suggested that the Burraga ride committee is not planning to award a completion prize for the 80k ride at their 120 elevator, Jo Davis will check with Jacque about prizes. Belinda elaborated verbally on her written report, referring to an incident during TPRing at Shahzada. John noted this incident referred to him. Discussion ensued. John tended his resignation as a chief steward and TPR, effectively immediately.

Kim's ideas: Volunteer time and warning system for people having falls

I would like to put a couple of thoughts to the committee for discussion at the September meeting, to give everyone time for thinking.

The membership needs to donate dedicated volunteer time at X number of rides as part of their membership. There are quite a few jobs that they can handle eg check points, pencilling, timing, running logbooks back and forwards, weighing, getting logbooks signed, handing out completion prizes and cards/books to those that want to leave early, offering tea and coffee to vets and other volunteers on base, replenishing toilet paper and so on. We don't seem to have enough people in general to carry out these jobs and those that are there are run off their feet.

An early warning system for those that repeatedly fall off and or injury themselves at rides: . If a person is flagged they have to have a doctor's certificate enabling them to ride at their next ride. The main reason for this is that we have quite a few older and elderly people who are falling off, what happens to our sport if someone dies. What will the ramifications be for our sport?

Please take some time to think about these ideas

Agreement that this sounds like a good proposal. It would need to go before an AGM. **Resolved** include as a discussion item at the AGM. Kim and Kerry to put the wording together.

Northern Rivers Zone

General discussion. This matter continues but all avenues appear to be exhausted Tony suggested that if John is in agreement, we drop the matter.
