Jo said the date Homewood had was not their original date. Kiwarrak was approved last month for September next year, agreement Kiwarrak was approved a week early. Decided Kiwarrak keeps the date.

Rides for approval -

Burraga Copper Challenge - 24-11-2018 - 20, 55, 85km

This ride application is for next month. The SMC needs three months before a ride is considered for approval. Jacque says that the SMC is able to override this rule and she has people available to run the ride. Tony discussed the three month rule and does not class this as a special circumstances event. If a ride dropped out and someone put their hand up to run a ride that would be classified as special circumstances. To add a ride to the calendar this late in the season would affect the point score results for the end of year. There would be people who have turned their horses out. Not really fair to pop a ride on like this particularly at the end of the year.

Jo said she would like to vote on whether this ride goes ahead and she would like Jacque to leave the room while this happened. . Jacque said it is not her who put this event forward. It is the Burraga District Association who has put this up for consideration. Jacque left the room at [7:31].

Tony read the paragraph concerning the three month rule where exceptional circumstances were mentioned. This ride booking form has been requested for months with no result. Jacque has been advertising that this ride is happening, doing this without SMC approval. Vote was duly taken by a show of hands. One for, six against this proposal. **Resolved** not to allow this ride to go ahead.

Jacque asked if she could take the proposal of holding a trainer for the November weekend to her committee. **Approved** that she may approach them. 20/40/60 would be a good idea and would encourage younger horses.

Belinda asked Jo if the rides approved would be on the 2019 calendar. Yes they will.

Jacque returned to the room at [7:35] and advised that the ride had been rejected, the reason being not enough notice and that this was not classified as exceptional circumstances.

Lachlan Endurance Riders – 16/17 March 2019 Bumbaldry or Neville to be decided – 20, 40, 80km

Organisers are not sure where the ride will be run and are just seeking the date. Resolved to approve.

Our total balance is down due to my paying a backlog of accounts to the AERA, particularly Insurances.

The best news is that although membership income is down by \$2,681.83 our ride income is up by \$6,127.27 which is an increase of 17.3%, which justifies our stance on "One ride, one weekend".

In real terms our total income for this year is actually up by \$1,504.27, last year we received a grant for \$25,00.00 and this somewhat skewed our income, hopefully, our current grant application for the same amount will be successful.

Newsletter: We experienced a printing problem with the latest newsletter. The back page ad showed a very red faced lady in the ad for brims on helmets. I have spoken to the printer and hopefully this will not happen again.

Zone Two: Windeyer ran as a twilight ride last Saturday. The ride was a total success with a lot of happy riders and no real problems. Windeyer is also tendering for an Easter Carnival. Tooraweenah is making plans to tender for the next NSW Quilty. Watch this spot for further details.

Talk of free entry to the Queensland Quilty for anyone living, outside the QERA boundary, including NSW riders.

Kerry Spratt: Secretary, Public Officer, AERA, IDP, Grants

Apologies for my non-attendance. I have an arrangement that was made around the previous date for our October meeting that I now can't change again. The correspondence has been sent previously, but is attached to the email with this report and the agenda.

- 1. The next AERA meeting is 10 and 11 November. We need to get any agenda items to Kim Moir ASAP. The closing date is 19 Oct. We have a SMC meeting scheduled for 9 November, Peter, Noni and I will be apologies.
- 2. The AERA draft Constitution has been circulated for comment. We need to decide whether we support it as a group and send any comments to the next AERA meeting. After that, we need to provide opportunity for discussion at our AGM. Please discuss it and provide comments to your delegates before 8 November. It's boring, but important.
- 3. Correspondence for discussion relating to:
 - disqualification of a rider.
 - newsletter ride review for the Brookvale ride.
 - resignation of memberships from Mindy Davies and Matthew Gadsby.
- 4. The TAS Quilty was a success for many of our riders, our Sky Blue team came second, as one of only two teams to have three successful completions. Could we arrange for this to be promoted please?
- 5. The Bullio ride committee has advised via the ride Facebook page that on course crewing will be available at their upcoming rides. On course crewing obviously is great, but I think we need to make sure that all riders have the same level of support, so we have an even playing field. I support on course crewing, but think the opportunity must be the same for all. Likewise, everyone must be clear on what will be permitted at the crewing points. Whatever is allowed needs to be agreed with the RO, SMC and CS before the ride, clearly stated and publicised for the riders.
- 7. I'm talking with Bec about the teams concept passed at the AGM, she will get her ideas to us in the next couple of weeks. More detail on the TV advertising strategy is coming, but what we do with that is dependant support mechanisms for the people who respond which is also a work in progress. Hold these over please.
- 8. As you know through an email I sent, I completed and submitted an application to Office of Sport for Sports Development Program funding in 2019/2020. The total amount we applied for is about \$29000, covering the items we discussed last meeting. I think any news will be some weeks or even months off. Stay tuned.

Discussion on Kerry's report took place. References to the points she has listed above.

Point 3: Correspondence relating to the disqualification was discussed, response as agreed.

Resolved to accept the membership resignations as requested.

Resolved no need to reply to the email about the newsletter as this was addressed to the Editor not the SMC.

Point 6: on-course crewing for the Bullio Cup. If this is to be approved then it must be available to every rider. There was an email from Noni but that was not available for the minutes. Is 'crewing area' the correct description or should it not be 'viewing area'? Matthew doesn't see a problem with this idea and feels that all rides should have on course

crewing/viewing areas. Suggestion is one crewing point per loop. **Resolved** to put a proposal together. Belinda to liaise with Kerry on what to say in the letter to go to the Bullio committee.

Point No. 7: Jacque should be able to show the next meeting what is going to happen with the YouTube stuff.

Resolved that NSW investigate the return to the use of membership cards

Jo Davis: Ride calendar

Matthew Walker: Horse Welfare, Early Warning System, Vet Liaison, Biosecurity

Early Warning looks good. Horse Welfare – no issues. Nothing further.

Belinda Hopley: Zone 5 Delegate, Chief Stewards and TPRs *Ride Reports-*

National Capital: 29-30/9/18, 80k, 53k, 40k, 22k & 13k.

Despite the dry weather (and fewer numbers due to the TQ and local equine events), ACTERA went ahead with their ride. Due to the very windy weather on the Friday before the ride a total fire ban was in place.

Unfortunately, the ride base direction signs were stolen both on Friday and Saturday nights, which did cause a little angst to a few early arrivals. The vetting area was rejigged to enable a better trot area and a less cramped TPR area. Some work had been done to the trot area but was limited due to the drought. It was a very cool start to the day, but the clouds cleared and became quite warm with a very light breeze. Over 70 riders attended the events – 30 in the 80k – which were well received by the riders. The rides were all dirt roads/fire trails, well-marked with ample water. The track had some rocky sections and was hard underfoot due to the drought. There were no invasive treatments. One rider returned from the 1st leg (80k) feeling unwell and withdrew. Two riders in the 80k who had assisted the ill rider were late but given completions. One rider was very disagreeable and rude on being vetted out lame after two trot outs. There is a short note here in camera.

One rider was spoken to about the horse containment policy re one horse per yard. One rider was disqualified the following day when it was discovered he had not changed his riding status from novice. While we did have enough volunteers on the day, it is recognized that we need to train more people and get more involved in the setup of the event.

There are quite a few CS reports outstanding - The Rock, Wandandian, Shahzada and Woodstock.

CS/TPR: Nothing to report.

South Coast Zone News: Nothing to report.

Grants Subcommittee: The bibs and the signage are done, and the TPR book quote is in the process. This should take up the remainder of the grant.

Other Stuff: The State Championship documents are nearly finished.

Woodstock – CS report handed to Belinda by John. Supposed to supply two copies of Form 7, one for the rider and one for the SMC. No problems with the ride. All good. Great attendance.
