Team rules review – QLD rides. Question from Sharon Foster who wanted a QERA ride included in the competition, Jax is seeking clarification that our competition covers NSW rides, dual affiliation rides and no other rides. Agreed that the Teams Competition is a NSWERA competition which does not include QERA rides.

Half price membership

Usually starts at 1 August and is half of whatever the membership full fee is. Possibly \$70.00. Noted that we need to cover AERA costs.

Alam gave a rationale to cover his suggestion of lowering the rebate, asking to consider a greater reduction than 50%, maybe 30% or 40% off.

AERA fees. Adult \$32. Junior \$16 Intermediate ?? Insurance is \$25. Total that we pay AERA per adult is \$57.

Bullio 29 and 30 October 2021-add an FEI three star to the event. Approved

Bullio Winter FEI Qualifier – 16-17th July 2021 – 100km * open/youth and 120* open/ youth. Originally on 14 August – need to change because of a QERA event. Kylie thinks these are a small group of people with horses that are set to focus on just FEI events. This event is only FEI. **Approved** providing 1) Tooraweenah and Currowan ROs don't object. Watagan Mountains 7-8th August 2021 – Amended to remove Saturday rides. Will be Sunday 40 and 80km only. **Approved**

Watagan Mountains – 2/3rd April 2022 – Saturday 40km, Sunday 10, 20, 40km. Check with Tumbarumba and Tooraweenah. John to contact Tooraweenah, Kylie to contact Watagan Mntns.

Central Ranges – 1-4th October 2021 – Friday – Mini Marathon 40km/day plus 20km, Saturday 20, 40, 80km – Sunday 40, 80km. Not running as it now clashes with the State ride

Murray River Ride – 24/25th July requesting dual Affiliation – no ride booking form yet only e-mail. Same weekend as Tooraweenah. **Resolved** no dual affiliation.

Tooraweenah 24 and 25 July 2021. Now planning a 160k elevator and 120k elevator with the 160 Quilty test event, rather than the previously booked 80k. Plus 40k training ride. No dedicated 160, just the elevator. Seems that a 160km ride is required by the AERA as a test event and an elevator is not sufficient because the entire event must be tested. Suggestions that there will definitely be people who will ride the 160k in order to qualify. 160 elevator with a midnight start. Or a 120 elevator with a separate entry fee. **Resolved** it must be a 160k event. No elevator for the 160k. Two separate events but people have the option of three separate distances. Tony will check with AERA.

State Championship 2021

Kylie doesnt have a report yet. LERC didn't know a report is needed at this stage. LERC are working full steam ahead organising prizes, merchandise etc. Have a major sponsor lined up and thinking about the

course. Coming along with regard to vets and chief stewards. Preview has been sent in to the newsletter. Kylie has flyers to go up at Mt Lagoon. Tony to forward the State ride document to LERC. Consider when to pay the \$6,000, Tony to discuss this with Linda Jonkers.

Ratification of decisions made between meetings.

2021 State ride, Johns River date, CM enquiry re membership, Rhys Powell accreditation Agreed to to write to the AERA regarding accreditation of Rhys Powell

A person who is currently not a member has contacted some of the executive about recommencing riding . Discussion took place. The person can participate as a day member. Agreed to revisit this if a membership application is received .

2019 NSW Office of Sport Grant: advertising campaign update (Bel) first aid courses update.

\$3,481.06 left in the Office of Sport grant. Need to allocate this by the end of June. Were going to purchase signs, Belinda will discuss this in her report. We could put another 12 months of Adobe against the grant.

Play by the rules No action

2022 AGM (place holder) date and venue: Discuss later in the meeting.

2021 and 2022 Quilty: update. 2021 Biosecurity plan, 2022, AERA agreement.

Noni discussed bio security, a resolution was reached between the AERA and the 2021 Quilty COmmittee. There is a 14 day out of Hendra hot zone requirement with a rapid Hendra exclusion blood test when horses enter WA. 20 day temperature log. Requirements relating to horses from adjoining zones has been removed. When the AERA finalse the biosecurity plan Noni will send it to the SMC.

AERA Agreement. AERA wants this as an interim event agreement, NSW ERA and Tooraweenah being asked to sign. Cost of buckles yet to be determined. AERA event levy and buckle payment within 14 days of receipt of invoice. Concern expressed in that it is an interim agreement because AERA has changed the terms of previous agreements at short notice. Also concerned that, the attachments which are referred to were not provided, so we don't know what we're beign asked to agree to. 1,000 mile buckles were usually paid for by the AERA but they are now saying it should be paid for by the Quilty committee. Kerry to get the missing information and the SMC will discuss the document in detail before signing it.

Ride Organisers' Panel (Charlie Gauci convener): No report

General and New Business

East Coast Championship/State of Origin proposal: Discussed earlier in the meeting.

Pre nomination refund guidelines review, including multiple day entries

ROs are doing their own thing regarding refund policies. Noted that people are not happy with the refund policy for Mtn Lagoon. The same refund policy is needed for all rides. Cutoff dates and late fees are issues. Problems are made worse by the uncertainy of COVID. Charlie enquired as what plan did the SMC want him to take back to the ROs. The SMC needs to discuss this further including whether there is a a percentage or formula. **Resolved** that Charlie consult ROs and feed back to the SMC for further discussion.

Kim Stephens: Treasurer, Snowy Zone delegate, Volunteer Coordinator

Attached are 3 reports that can be used to obtain the Day Member Numbers for the liability insurance, \$12/day member that we are paying to AERA – all 3 reports add up to something different. We also pay the rider affiliation fee of \$4.00/any rider entries. Linda would like to have a phone link up with me to explain the amount of day members that NSWERA are being charged

There are 3 reports available that add up the day members through Aeraspace

- 1. Is the report that is available to Jax NSWERA Secretariat
- 2. Is a report available through the public Aeraspace that anyone can access
- 3. Is a report that only Deb, the AERA Bookkeeper, can access

My first conversation was with Deb as the last AERA invoice charged us for 195 day members. Deb also felt that this was rather high. This instigated both Deb and I looking further into the reports available.

It now comes down to that Linda thinks the AERA report is right and I think it is wrong. I feel that if everyone can have a look I may be missing something If you have any questions please contact me. We also need to give Linda a time for a phone link up between herself, Deb Edwards, Jax Barlow, Kerry Fowler-Smith and myself. feel that it may take a bit of discussion between us before we talk to Linda

Tony asked Kim for a treasurer's report which Kim said was sent in the middle of May.. The only thing she has in abeyance are day members as outlined above. Jax, Kerry and Kim to meet with Deb. Kim to arrange this meeting.

Kerry Fowler Smith: Secretary, Public Officer, AERA, IDP, Grants

Fiona Meller has asked that Kerry send the submission we have already made to the NPWS officer and that Kerry or somebody else attend a meeting with this officer to discuss a general approach regarding private property access for riders. There is a problem with people using private property to access National Parks, in this case Wollemi. Noted that whatever happens here, will affect the whole of NSW and the National Parks.

Does anyone have any objections to Kerry going with Fiona to this meeting? Faith is happy for Kerry to go but if Kerry cannot go, Faith is happy to attend. Discussion about the SMC being neutral in this issue, noting differences of opinion amongst members local to the area.

Letter to the AERA regarding the motion passed by members at our AGM . Kerry has drafted the letter but wants to be sure all are happy with what she wrote. **Resolved** that the letter be sent as it is currently drafted.

Kerry said following on from what John just said Kerry needs John to stop harassing her for newsletter reports. She is suggesting that she is considering it to be harassment. Helen is to stop asking her for reports as well as she knows the due date.

Peter Bice: Ride Standards/Feedback No report

Matthew Walker: Horse Welfare, Early Warning System, Vet Liaison, Biosecurity No report.

Belinda Hopley: Chief Stewards and TPRs, Grants, Tumbarumba. 3-4/4/21, 20 & 40k Sat, 20, 40 & 80k Sun.

It was a hilly ride with some rocky sections, with rode base at 650m alt climbing to 1,100m. It was a humid ride for that area. It was a well organised ride with many volunteers.

One invasive treatment form was issued – the rider was witnessed riding recklessly and cantered off after stating to fellow riders that her horse was tying up. It was noted to be acutely lame during the trot-up and upon further investigation was treated for ty-up and given a 4 week RO.

Tooraweenah. 10-11/4/21, 5 & 20k Sat, 20, 40 & 80k Sun.

Perfect, cool riding conditions, with a slight breeze on a sunny day. Some of the tracks were very rocky due the recent rain. he ride flowed very smoothly from pre-ride to the computer. There were no vetting delays.

One rider commented she had gotten lost and re-wound to the point she left the track. The rider commented that there were a number of riders in front of her but continued and feels they went the wrong way. The CS spoke to the course designer who commented it was hard to get lost or cheat. When checking with the radio operators, all riders went thru' the checkpoints from the correct direction. It was noted that some ride arrows have fallen down as this course is largely on private land and remains permanently marked. The course was checked pre-ride by motor bikes and glow sticks were used. There were no invasive treatments.

Bumbaldry. 24-25/4/21.5,10, 20 & 40k Sat, 20, 40 & 80k Sun.

The district had received reasonable rain prior to the ride which softened the tracks. The course is mainly flattish combining gravel roads, forestry tracks and private property with a few sections of single file track. There were no complaints regarding the course or the marking, and many favorable comments were received. Excellent riding conditions (cool and dry with a breeze Sunday) were enjoyed by the riders.

There were sufficient personnel for the weekend and no forms were issued.

The ETS was used for both days - no tags were lost nor did the network drop out.

The Arrival/Departure Gate was run by one person for both days as was the Vet Gate.

Vetting data was entered remotely in the vet ring by Erica, the end of leg weight were entered remotely by the weighing steward and Tom entered the BC scores remotely.

I believe everyone involved were impressed and happy with the functionality of the ETS.

Only 1 Etag was not returned but was since found by LERC and will be returned at the Mudgee ride.

Mudgee, 16/5/21, 20, 40 & 80k.

The course was run thru' paddocks, dirt roads and bush tracks with very little tar. It was flat to undulating. Saturday was clod, cloudy and windy, with a cool start to a great sunny day on Sunday.

A few more volunteers would have saved some stress.

1 horse was given a 2 week RO for a mild tie-up.

CS/TPR -

I would like to recommend and congratulate 2 more TPRs - Ian Mepham and Sophie Counsell. Ian did the course at Tumbarumba this year and is already accredited!!

I have contacted Tina and she is agreeable to doing 1 more ride as a provisional CS.

There are still 2 CS's that have not renewed their membership.

Just for info -

From '07 to '21 – 174 TPR attendants / 49 accredited (28%)

Practicing TPR's from 174 = 12 (7%) or 49 = 12 (24%).

Other -

The Information sessions are finished. We ran 10 sessions all up, with around 80 attendees. The presenters engaged the newcomers as evidenced by the many questions asked and often voicing that they wanted to do the right thing by their horse and fellow riders. Feedback was also very positive from both riders and presenters. Many of them have started their riding and are looking forward to challenging themselves and horses, even if it is just to 40k for the moment! Faith, April and I give our thanks to all the presenters for giving their time and sharing their knowledge so freely. Many thanks to Noni for setting up the sessions and sending me the recordings to put into notes.

I have rang Eaglehawk and am awaiting their reply. I have brought the CS case, ordered the scanner, scales and bibs. I have not yet ordered the ride signs. Attached is the - SC Agreement and Think Tank Ideas. - Capping

The ride secretary/contact list needs updating.

Consider 2 x \$5 scratchies and thank you card for each presenter as thank you for doing presentations. Some discussion on the AGM proposed venue.

April Newman: Zone 5 delegate. Promotions, Grants

Zone 5 held a meeting in the 13th of May at Mollymook Golf Club. Rides discussed were Currowan and Sussex inlet/Falls Creek, which are both on track for their dates. Next year zone 5 is looking great with the possibility of 6 rides on the calendar.

Other items discussed were:

- ideas for grants for NSW ERA, it was thought maybe more could be done for publicity maybe through Facebook adds, maybe a grant could be secured for State level publication through advertisement done professionally?
- Volunteering was discussed on how rides could get more TPR's. One idea was people who TPR
 could get a discount on membership or entries for either themselves or a friend/ family member, if
 they do not ride.
- The shortage of vets in the sport and how to attract more vets to the sport. Ideas include vets being or
 paid travel to events, perhaps subsidised by NSW ERA. It was also suggested that vets be
 approached by an external (to the SMC) person and queried on their experience at rides and how
 they were treated. This is to better improve how ride organisers accommodate vets and recognise
 that vets are a necessity of our sport.

The Zone would also like to see the zone competition get back up and running between zones as it did in the past and feels it creates more of a community feel among endurance riders.

The zone would also like to know what the cost of NSW ERA merchandise is, as it was suggested at an SMC meeting that NSW ERA would sell left-over merchandise at cost price for clubs to use as prizes.

Wingello ride was run on the 22nd of May. It was extremely well organised, and well attended, with 172 riders across the 5km, 10km, 20km, 40km with a massive amount of new comers to the sport . Well done Bec!

Mogendoura club was contacted and told about the new ride set up grant from NSW ERA. As the club is newly formed they qualified for the \$350 worth of arrows / signage.
